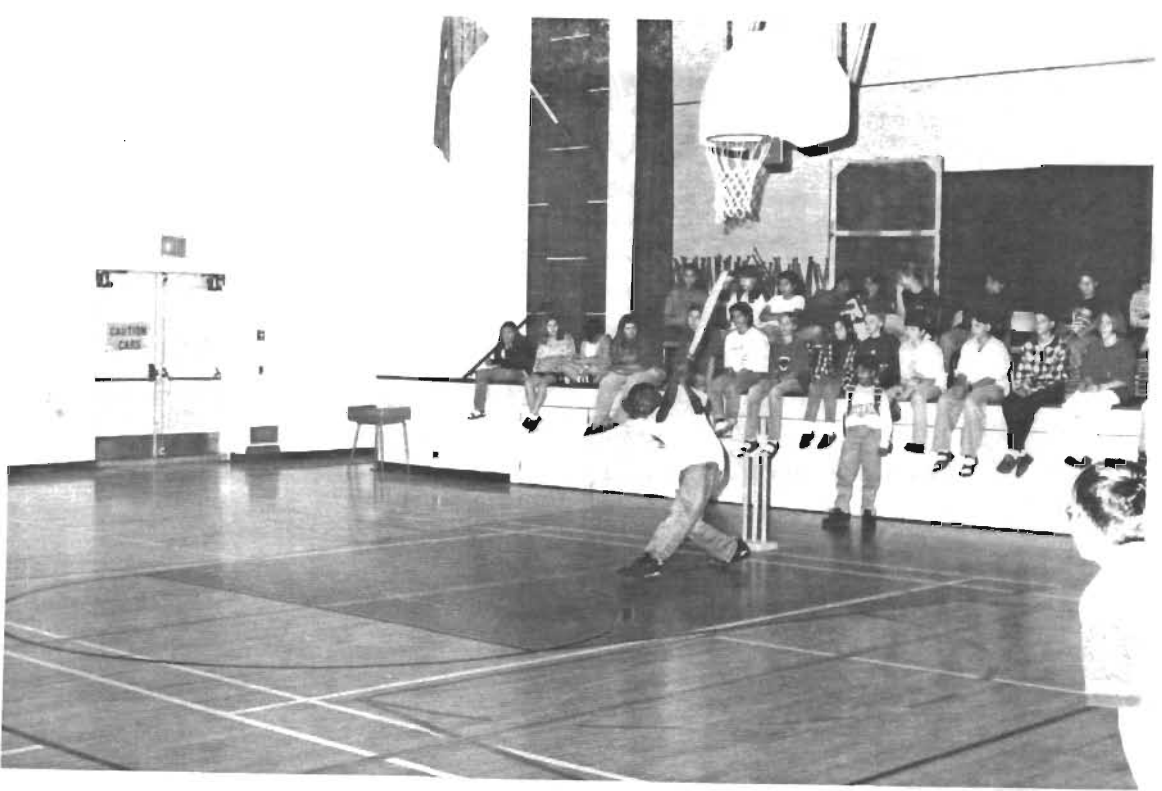

Cricket Coaching Co-ordinator's Welcome and Report.

The Executive Members of the Alberta Schools Cricket Association was elected for the first year of operation in 1995-96, on a preamble. The Alberta Schools Cricket Association was formed in January 1995, with a goal to introduce and increase awareness and enjoyment of the sport of Cricket among youth, and to encourage and promote competitive cricket among local schools.

The initial response from schools introduced to the ideas of the Alberta Schools Cricket Association was very encouraging. Beaumont High School, Avalon Junior High School, and J. Percy Page High School have introduced Cricket into the school sports curriculum. The modified game of Kanga Ball Cricket was the main theme used to introduce participants to the game of Cricket. We envision many more members added to our Association from Edmonton, Calgary and the rest of Alberta.

The most developed youth from schools were given special training indoor during the winter and outdoor in the summer months. With the talent available from this squad, it was a must to enter a combined schools team to play in the 'B' Division League Tournament of the Edmonton & District Cricket League. This team was named the ASCA Cricket Club where only youth under 25 years of age in the current year were allowed to play. It was a remarkable achievement for the ASCA Team to be placed third in the 'B' Division standings, Having lost to the champions in a close finish. In the six-a-side senior tournament, they defeated an 'A' Division team in the preliminaries. The ASCA Cricket Club will be a powerful force in the future of Cricket in Alberta!

I must thank the Principals of Beaumont High School, J. Percy Page High School and Avalon Junior High School, for having introduced Cricket into their respective sports curriculum. We expect more schools to join the ASCA in the near future. The ASCA Cricket Club also consisted of students from Ross Sheppard High School, M. E. Lazerte, Parkview Elementary School, HillCrest, Jasper Place, Harry Ainlay, MillWoods Christian School, St. Hilda, W.P. Wagner, and the University of Alberta.

Special Achievements:

Damian Persaud...Ross Shepard High School.... Captained the ASCA Team, was selected to play for the Senior City Team, Edmonton. In the 'A' Division of the League he made 4 x 50s, and one Century. Persaud was selected to captain the Canadian youth team in Toronto, 1996. Had the most number of wickets at this tournament, and made a half century. Selected to Vice-Captain the Canadian youth team to tour Bermuda this year. Excellent Cricketer and all-rounder with a great sports future. Highest individual score for ASCA, 62.

Fouad Choudhary...Jasper Place High School, University of Alberta... Captained the ASCA team, did a remarkable job in his first experience as Captain. He commanded respect from his team. Very good all-rounder.

Adeel Hussain...M.E. Lazerte High School...Was selected to play for the City Under 25 Team in 1996. Vice-Captain, ASCA Cricket Club. Represented Canada at the under 15 World Cup Challenge in England, 1996. Had the highest aggregate in batting and most number of wickets for the ASCA Cricket Club in 1996. Highest score, 61 not out. Best Bowling Figures, 4 wickets for 20 runs, which includes a hat trick. Useful all-rounder, has the ability to play for Canada before long.

Mansoor Choudhary...L.B. Pearson High School, Calgary ...Selected to play for the senior city team, Calgary, 1996. Represented Canada in the youth tournament, Toronto, 1996. Made a highest score of 78 versus Eastern Canada. 35 versus Denmark. Selected to play for Canada Youth Team to tour Bermuda this year. Good all-rounder with a great future. Wicket keeper too, a great asset to Canada. Had 6 catches in one inning, in the League Games, and made three 50s for his Club.

Salman Choudhary...Jasper Place High School...Was alternate for the under 15 Canadian Team to tour England in 1996. Captained the six-a-side ASCA Team that defeated an 'A' Division team. At this tournament he was awarded the most promising schools cricketer trophy. Best bowling figures, 5 wickets for 11 runs. Very aggressive batsman, and a good seam bowler, should play for Canada in the near future.

David Redoy...Avalon Junior High School... Harry Ainlay Composite High School...Most promising schoolboy cricketer, 1996. Good all-rounder, expected to do great feats in 1997. Highest score for ASCA, 72. Selected to play for the under 25, City team, 1996. He made a remarkable inning in batting at this tournament.

Fahad Choudhary...Hillcrest Junior High School...Good wicketkeeper who could bowl when the need arises. Had the most number of catches for ASCA this 1996 season.

Eric Hanoman...M.E. Lazerte High School...Could easily walk into the Canadian Team, as a leg spinner, before long. He will be put through some strenuous practice this 1997 season. Safe wicketkeeper too. Selected to play for the Under 25 City Team, 1996.

Mukesh Khullar...Harry Ainlay Composite High School...Excellent pace bowler. Selected to play in the under 25 City team, 1996.

Darren Vishnu...J. Percy Page High School... Selected to play for the Under 25 City team, 1996.

Anil Patel...Harry Ainlay Composite High School... Selected to play in the Under 25 City team, 1996.

Festivals

The first schools and women's Kanga Ball Cricket Festival was held on June 22, 1996, at Victoria Park in Edmonton. This day's event was a complete success. In 1997, it is scheduled to be held on June 21, at MillWoods Park. This event will be a major attraction in the Cricket Community in Edmonton.

Projects for 1997

1. Plan to establish ASCA Cricket grounds at Diamond Park. This project is under consideration by Parks & Recreation. If approved, we will have a synthetic, permanent pitch from the famous Knott's Sports Cricket pitches, choice of system to suit all playing needs, offering excellent playing characteristics and low maintenance.

2. Practice Net cage at MillWoods Park. This is almost approved and work will begin in May, 1997. Here too, the idea is to establish a permanent Cricket Pitch.

3. A professional bowling machine will be ordered and ready for use in the 1997 season.

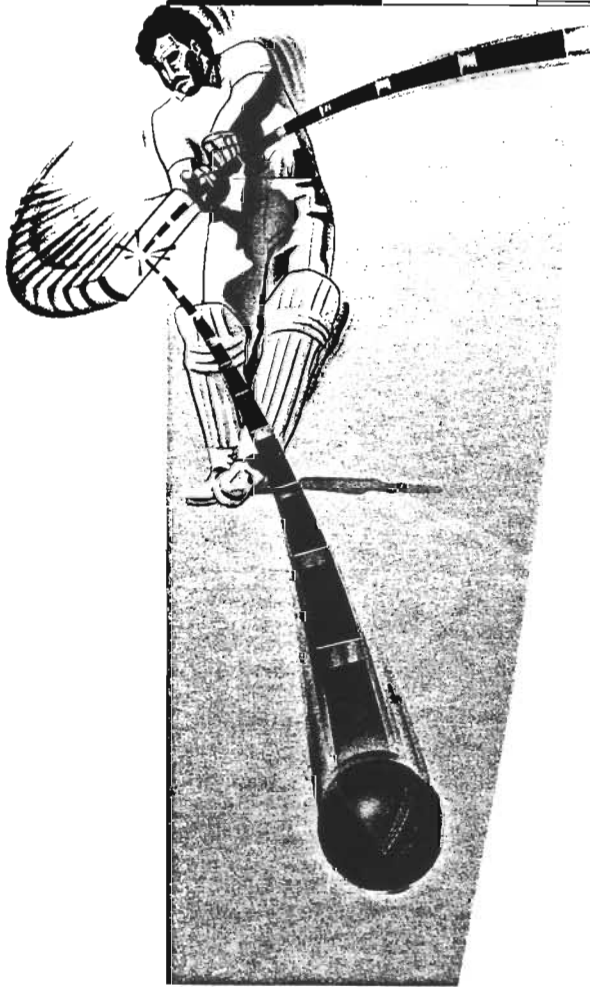
and this machine can use any type of ball, and can be made to bowl fast, medium and spin. This investment will be very prudent and provide great opportunity for young cricketers in Alberta.

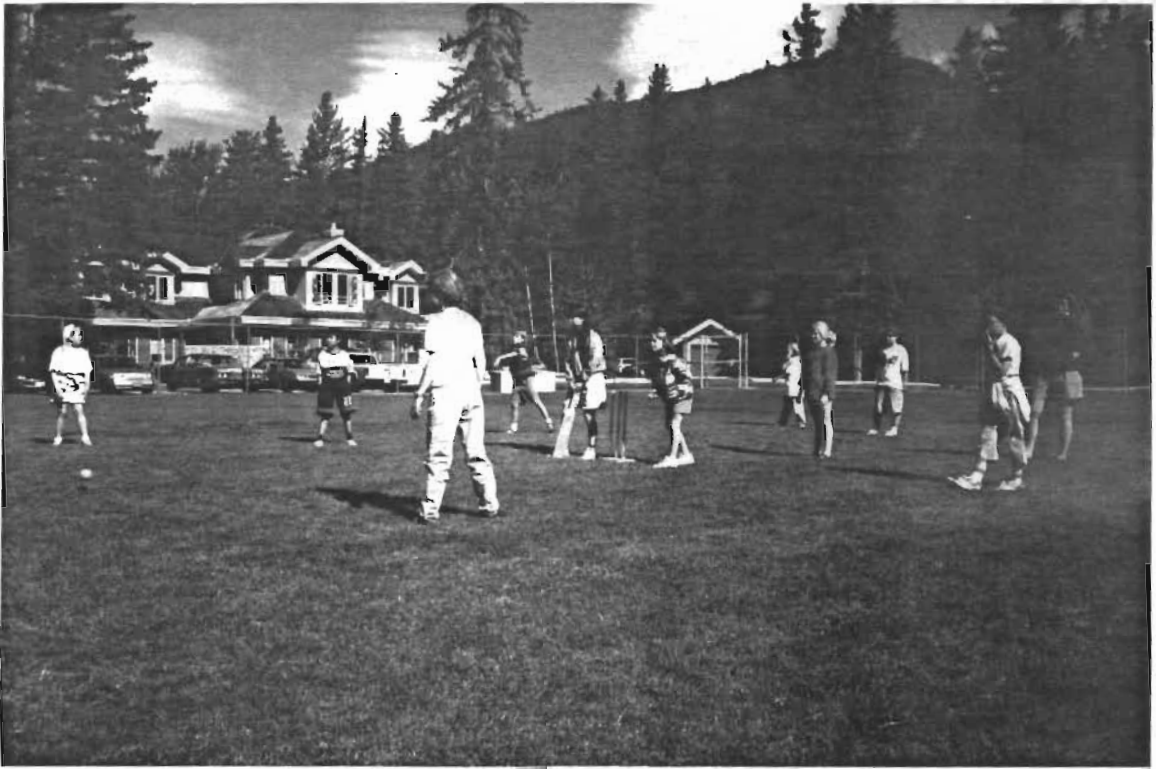



BYLAWS

ALBERTA SCHOOLS CRICKET ASSOCIATION

Revised January 1997

- (1) **TITLE:**
The Organization shall be called the Alberta Schools Cricket Association, hereinafter referred to as ASCA.
- (2) **OFFICE:**
ASCA shall have its office in the City of Edmonton in the Province of Alberta, Canada.
- (3) **SEAL OF THE ASSOCIATION:**
There shall be no seal in the name of the ASCA.
- (4) **OBJECTIVES:**
ASCA shall endeavour to:
 - (a) Promote the playing of both Cricket and Kanga Ball in schools across the Province of Alberta.
 - (b) Provide all registered school cricketers the opportunity to play competitive cricket.
 - (c) Facilitate interprovincial schools competitions.
 - (d) Enter a team called the ASCA Cricket Club in the E&DCL competition each year.
- (5) **AFFILIATION:**
ASCA shall be affiliated with the Alberta Cricket Association (ACA), the Canadian Cricket Association (CCA) and such other provincial and national associations/organizations as its members may deem necessary.
- (6) **MEMBERSHIP:**
 - (a) ASCA shall comprise those schools, universities, junior colleges and other teams/ organizations approved as members, in the manner hereinafter provided.
 - (b) Application for membership shall be made in writing to the Secretary of the ASCA on or before the Annual General Meeting to be held in February of each calendar year.
 - (c) An application for membership from an organization shall contain the names, addresses, dates of birth and telephone numbers of all players registered with the organization. All registered players shall be between the ages of ten and twenty-five years by December 31st of the calendar year.
 - (d) All member organizations shall have a liaison of their choosing who shall serve as a Member Representative on the Board of Directors of the ASCA.
 - (e) A member organization shall retain membership in the ASCA subject to Clause 7 of these Bylaws.
- (7) **MEMBERSHIP FEES:**
 - (a) Annual dues shall be determined by the Executive Committee and approved by the members at the Annual General Meeting.
 - (b) Dues shall be payable to the Treasurer of the ASCA at the Annual General Meeting by all members unless a notice in writing of withdrawal of a member has been received by the Executive Committee on or before December 31st of the preceding calendar year.
 - (c) An organization whose dues are ninety days in arrears shall be deemed to have allowed its membership to lapse. The said organization shall be able to resume its membership upon payment of the dues owing.
- (8) **EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE:**
 - (a) The Executive Committee of the ASCA shall comprise a President, Vice-President, Secretary and a Treasurer, all of whom shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting and whose duties shall be as follows, as well as the ACA Cricket Coaching Coordinator and the cricket coach appointed by ASCA:
 - (i) **The President:**
The President shall be an ex-officio member of all committees. He shall, when present, preside at all meetings of the ASCA and of the Board of Directors. In his absence, the Vice-President shall preside at any such meetings, and in the absence of both, a Chairman may be elected by the meeting to preside thereat.
 - (ii) **Vice-President:**
Refer to (i) above.
 - (iii) **Secretary:**
It shall be the duty of the Secretary to attend all meetings of the ASCA, and of the Board of Directors, and to keep accurate minutes of the same. In case of the absence of the Secretary, these duties shall be discharged by any such Officer as may be appointed by the meeting. The Secretary shall be in communication with the ACA CCC for all matters relating to the ACA.
 - (b) The Executive Committee shall be charged with conducting the affairs of the ASCA. It shall decide on any problems that arise during the season. The Executive Committee shall meet at any time at the call of the President. A quorum of the Executive Committee shall comprise at least three of its members. All decisions of the Executive Committee shall be final and binding upon all members of the ASCA.
 - (c) The Executive Committee members shall serve until their successors are appointed at the next Annual General Meeting. Any vacancy occurring during the year shall be filled at the next meeting of ASCA, provided it is so stated in a duly circulated notice calling for such a meeting.
 - (d) Any Executive Member, upon a majority vote of all members in good standing, may be removed from office, for any cause that the ASCA may deem reasonable.
 - (i) **The President:**
The President shall be an ex-officio member of all committees. He shall, when present, preside at all meetings of the ASCA and of the Board of Directors. In his absence, the Vice-President shall preside at any such meetings, and in the absence of both, a Chairman may be elected by the meeting to preside thereat.
 - (ii) **Vice-President:**
Refer to (i) above.
 - (iii) **Secretary:**
It shall be the duty of the Secretary to attend all meetings of the ASCA, and of the Board of Directors, and to keep accurate minutes of the same. In case of the absence of the Secretary, these duties shall be discharged by any such Officer as may be appointed by the meeting. The Secretary shall be in communication with the ACA CCC for all matters relating to the ACA.
 - (e) **Treasurer:**
 - (a) The Treasurer shall receive all monies paid to the ASCA and shall be responsible for the deposit of the same in whatever bank, trust company, credit union or treasury branch the Board of Directors may specify. The Treasurer shall properly account for all funds of the ASCA and shall be required to keep such records as may be deemed necessary.
 - (b) The Treasurer shall present a full detailed account of receipts and disbursements to the Board of Directors upon request and shall prepare for submission to the Annual General Meeting, a duly audited statement as hereinafter set forth, of the financial position of the ASCA, and submit a copy of the same to the Secretary for the records of the ASCA.

(9) **OFFICERS:**

(a) The Officers of the ASCA shall comprise the members of the Executive Committee of the ASCA as well as the the Women's Coordinator and its Junior Coordinators. Any Member Representative of the ASCA that is in good standing shall be eligible to hold any office in the ASCA.

(b) Parents of players listed in membership applications (clause 6) shall be eligible to be invited to participate or co-opted to serve on the Board or on committees or sub-committees as deemed fit by the Executive or the Board. Parent officers shall be deemed to be ex-officio members of the Board, but without voting privileges.

(10) **BOARD OF DIRECTORS:**

(a) The Board of Directors of the ASCA shall consist of its Executive and at least three other Member Representatives, all of whom shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting.

(b) A quorum at a Board of Directors meeting shall be three members of the Executive Committee, one other Officer of the ASCA and one representative from each member organization.

(c) The immediate Past-President and the ACA CCC shall be deemed to be ex-officio members of the Board of Directors but without voting privileges.

(11) **AUDITING:**

(a) The books, accounts and records of the Treasurer shall be audited annually by a qualified accountant, or by two members of the ASCA duly appointed for this purpose at the Annual General Meeting. A complete and properly audited statement of the ASCA's finances for the previous year shall be presented at the Annual General Meeting.

(b) The fiscal year of the ASCA shall be from January 1st to December 31st.

(c) The books and records of the ASCA may be inspected by any member of the ASCA at the Annual General Meeting provided for herein or at any time, upon providing reasonable notice to and making suitable arrangements with the Officer or Officers having charge of the same. Each member of the Executive Committee shall, at all times, have access to such books and records, if they should so desire.

(12) **MEETINGS:**

(a) The ASCA shall hold an Annual General Meeting in February of each calendar year, of which written notice shall be delivered by mail to the last known address of each Member Representative, at least fourteen days prior to the date of the meeting. All members of the Board of Directors and the Executive Committee shall be elected at this meeting.

(b) General Meetings of the ASCA may be called at any time by the Secretary or ACA CCC by way of written notice to all Member Representatives, delivered by mail, fourteen days prior to the day of such a meeting.

(c) A Special Meeting shall be called by the President upon receipt of a petition signed by at least two Member Representatives in good standing, specifying the reason for calling such a meeting. Written notice of this meeting shall be delivered by mail to all Member Representatives and members of the Board of Directors, at least fourteen days prior to the meeting.

(13) **VOTING:**

(a) Any member who has not withdrawn from membership nor been suspended or expelled as specified herein, shall have the right to vote at any meeting of the ASCA, provided the vote is made in person and not by proxy or otherwise.

(b) Decisions at all meetings of the ASCA shall be on the basis of the majority of members present and voting. The Chairman shall have a casting vote only.

(14) **ELECTIONS:**

Any member who has not withdrawn from the ASCA, nor been suspended or expelled as specified herein, shall be eligible for any office of the ASCA.

(15) **REMUNERATION:**

Unless authorized at a meeting, and after notice for the same shall have been given, a Director, Committee Member, Member Representative or an Officer of the ASCA shall not receive any remuneration for his services.

(16) **BORROWING POWERS:**

For the purpose of carrying out its objectives, the ASCA may borrow or raise or secure the payment of money in such manner as it sees fit, and in particular by the issue of debentures, but this power shall be exercised only under the authority of the members of the ASCA, and in no case shall debentures be raised without the sanction of a special resolution of the ASCA.

(17) **SIGNATURE ON DOCUMENTS:**

The Treasurer's signature shall be mandatory with the signature of another Executive Member. In the absence of the Treasurer, the Executive Committee shall decide the authorization of the signature.

(18) **AMENDMENTS:**

These Bylaws may be amended or repealed by an extraordinary resolution passed by a majority of not less than three quarters of the Member Representatives entitled to vote and present at a General Meeting, of which thirty days written notice, specifying the intention to propose the resolution as an extraordinary resolution, has been duly given.

(19) **DISCIPLINARY COMMITTEE:**

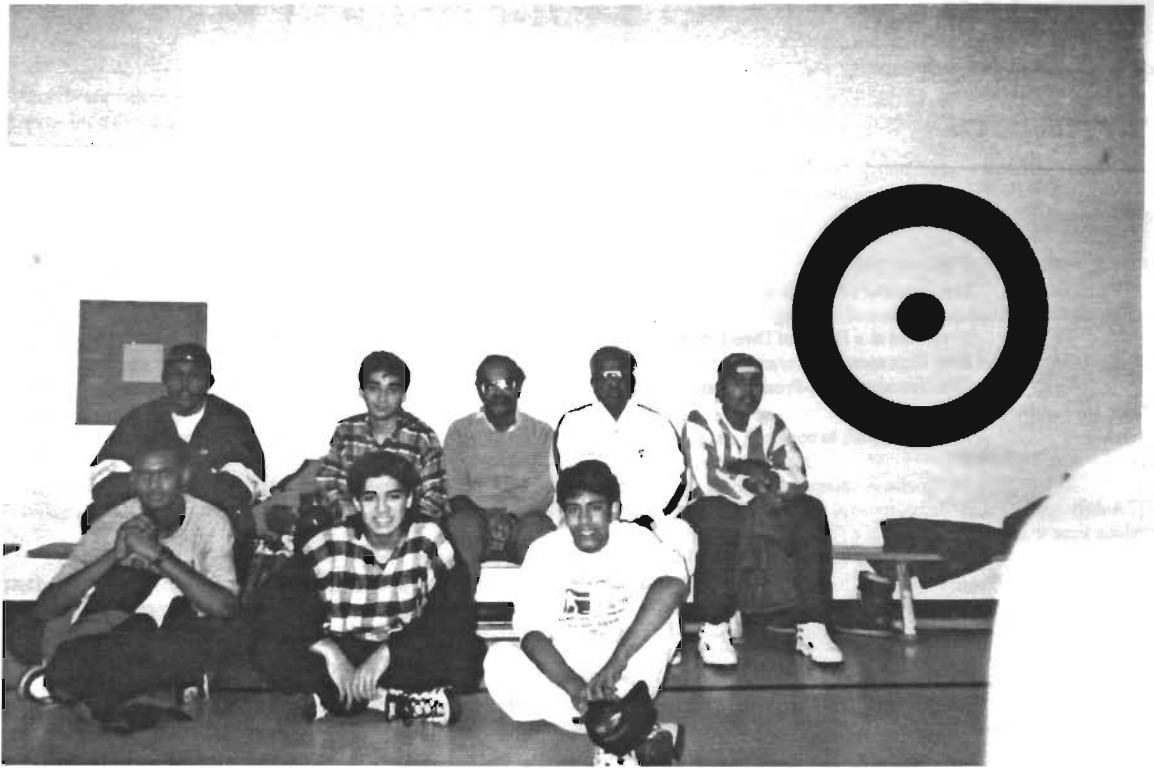
(a) The Executive Committee shall act in the capacity of a Disciplinary Committee, dealing with all disciplinary matters brought to its attention.

(b) Any member(s) alleged to have acted in a manner that is not in the best interests of the ASCA can be brought before the Executive Committee for disciplinary action. Should an Executive Member be brought to disciplinary action, he or she shall be required to resign from that position.

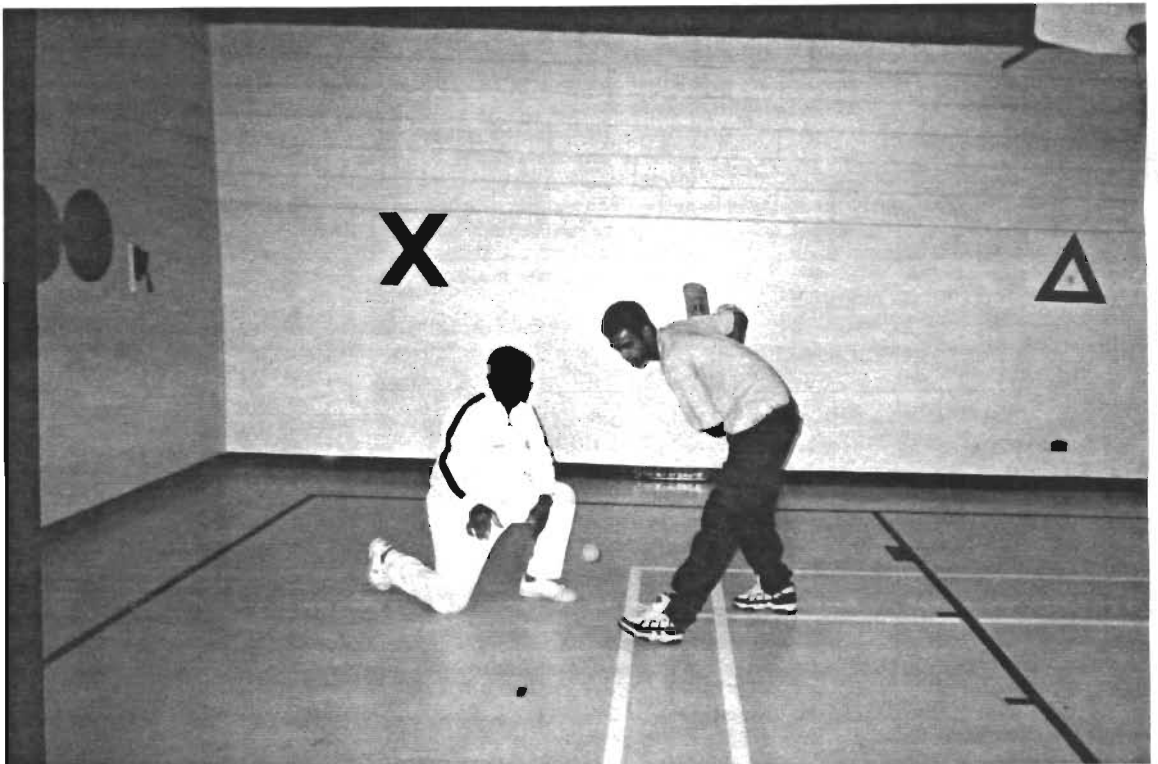
(c) All matters of a disciplinary nature must be submitted in writing either to the Secretary of the ASCA or the ACA CCC, whereupon the Executive Committee shall proceed to investigate the matter.

(20) **DISSOLUTION:**

In the event that the ASCA should have to be dissolved, all its properties and assets shall be sold. The proceeds from this sale, together with other monies, remaining property and records, shall then be handed over to the ACA. In the absence of the ACA or the CCA, all the monies, property and records shall instead be given to a charitable organization within the Province of Alberta.

January 1997.**

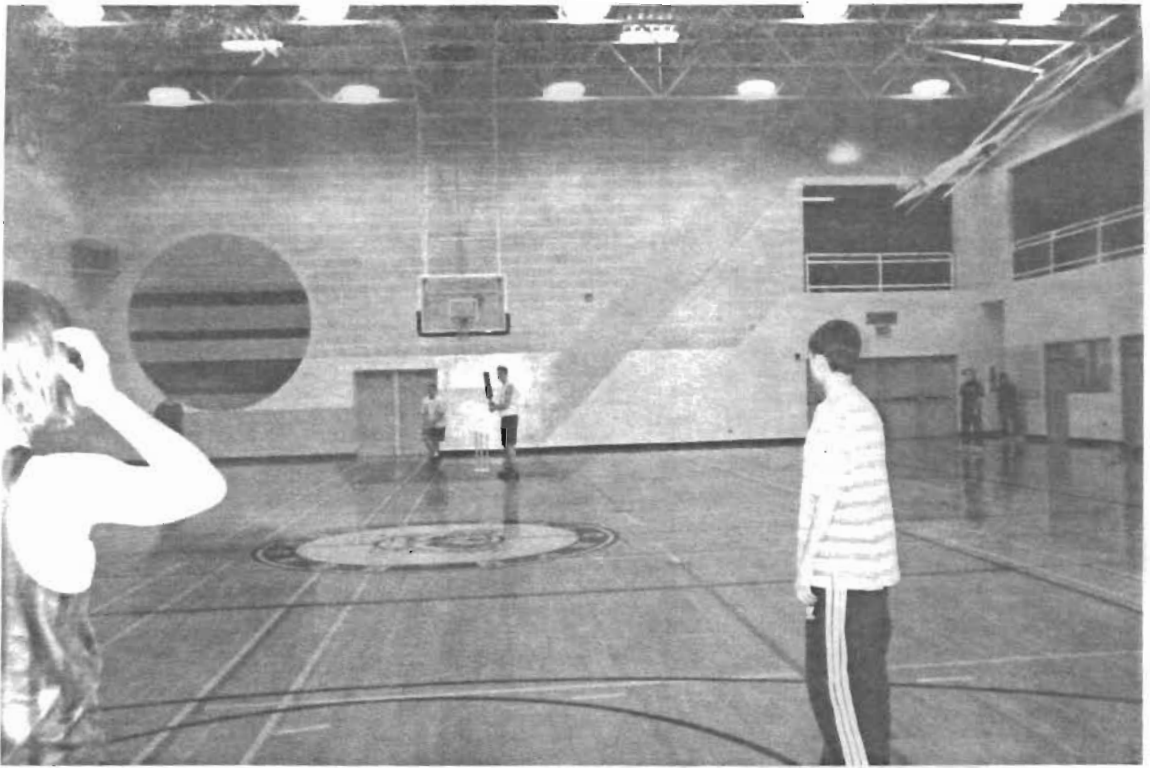

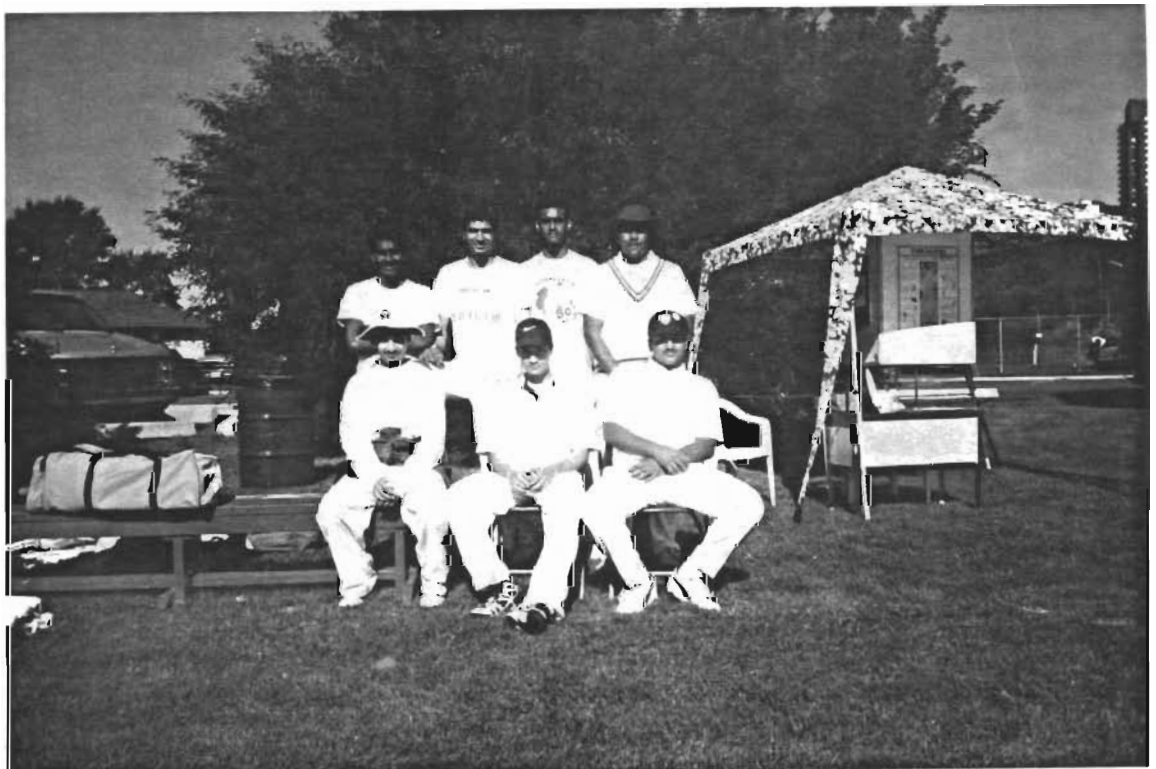
