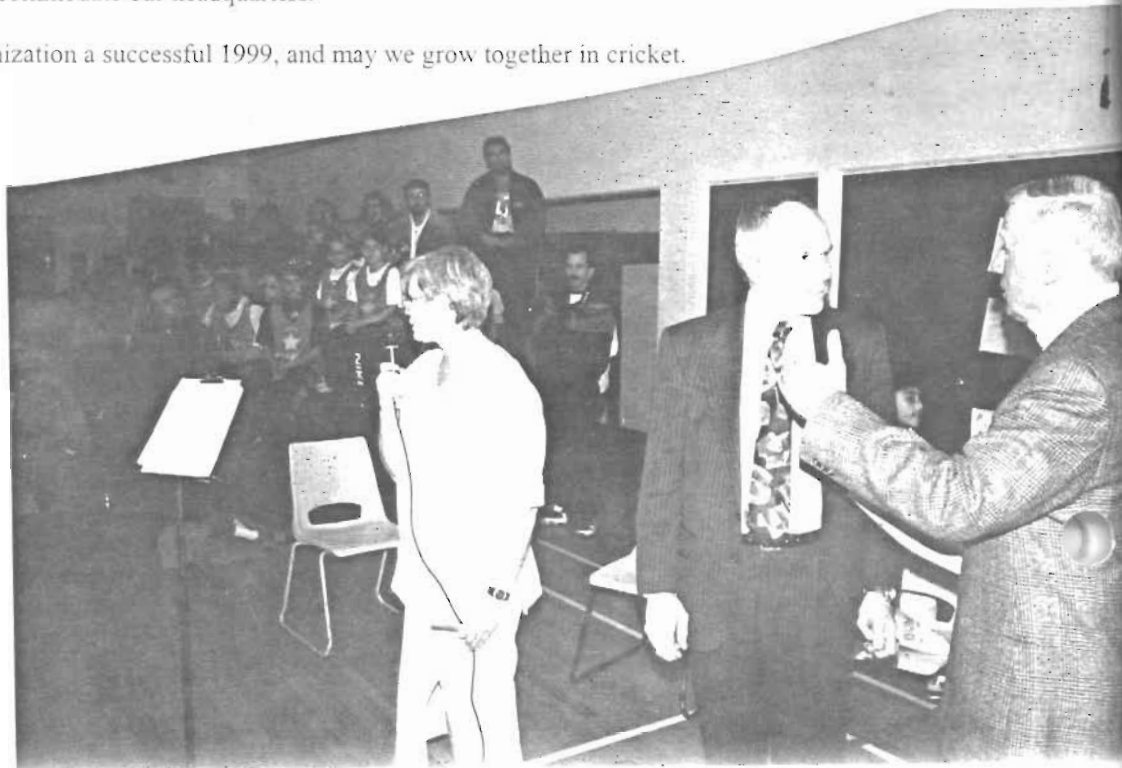

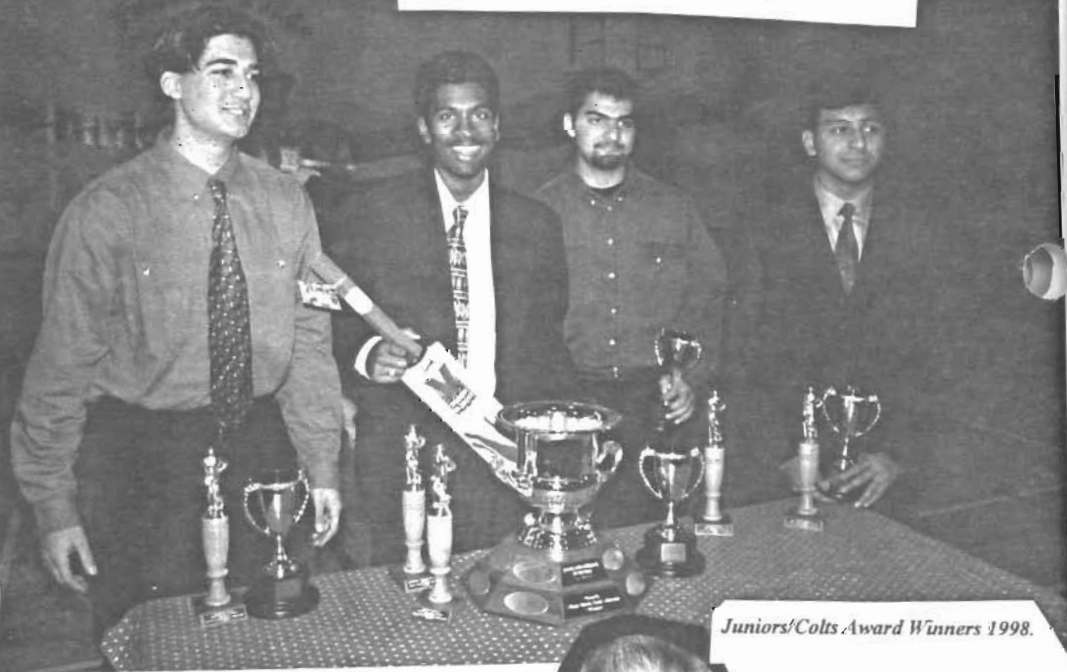

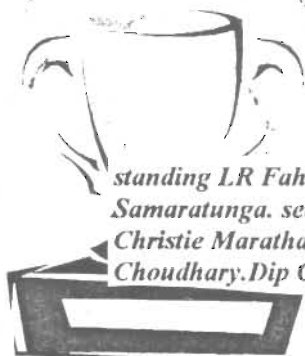

LH stylish opening batsman, and wicket keeper. Represented the junior and U25 City Teams in Edmonton. Played "A" division cricket in Edmonton.

ERIC HANOMAN Edmonton, Alberta

RA opening fast bowler and RH attacking middle order batsman. Can also bowl leg spin with the old ball. Eric is a safe fielder at all positions and can also be used as a back up keeper. Played representative cricket in Edmonton.

TOM JALANI Winnipeg, Manitoba

Tom is a RH middle order batsman and RA medium pace bowler.

JACOB RAMKELAWAN Edmonton, Alberta

At 15 he will be one of the youngest players at the tournament. He is a solid RH batsman with a great future. Jacob is also a useful RA medium pace bowler and good fielder in any position. Has played representative cricket for Edmonton at various levels.

PRAHLAD DAVID REDOY Edmonton, Alberta

Attacking LH batsman who likes to bat at #3. He is an excellent cover point fielder and can bowl RA spin if needed. Plays "A" division cricket in Edmonton and has represented the city both at the junior and U25 levels.

RA off spinner, RH middle order batsman. Vivek is a safe fielder at any position and can also keep wicket if needed.

SHAWN SAMARATUNGA Edmonton, Alberta

Bowls RA medium off cutters. RH low order batsman and good fielder.

PAUL ZIESMANN Winnipeg, Manitoba

Paul is a right hand middle order batsman. At just 16 he has an excellent future in the game.

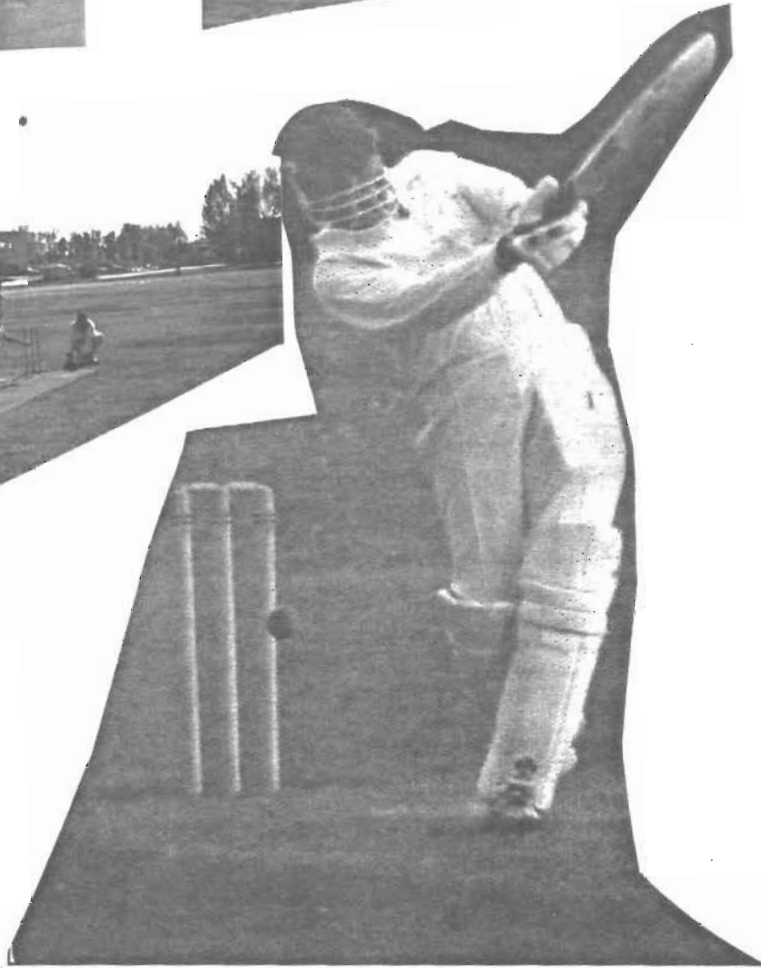
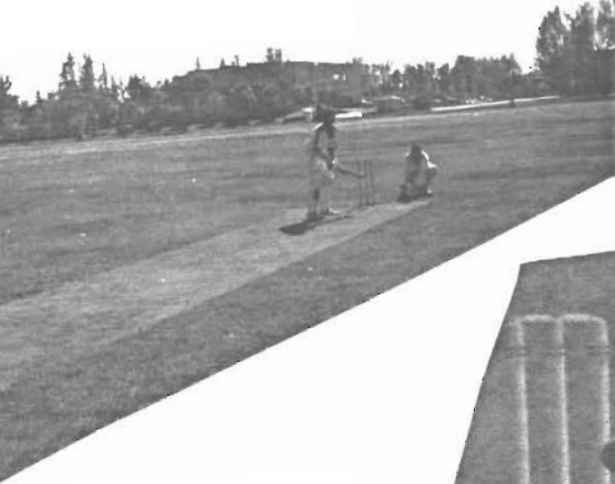

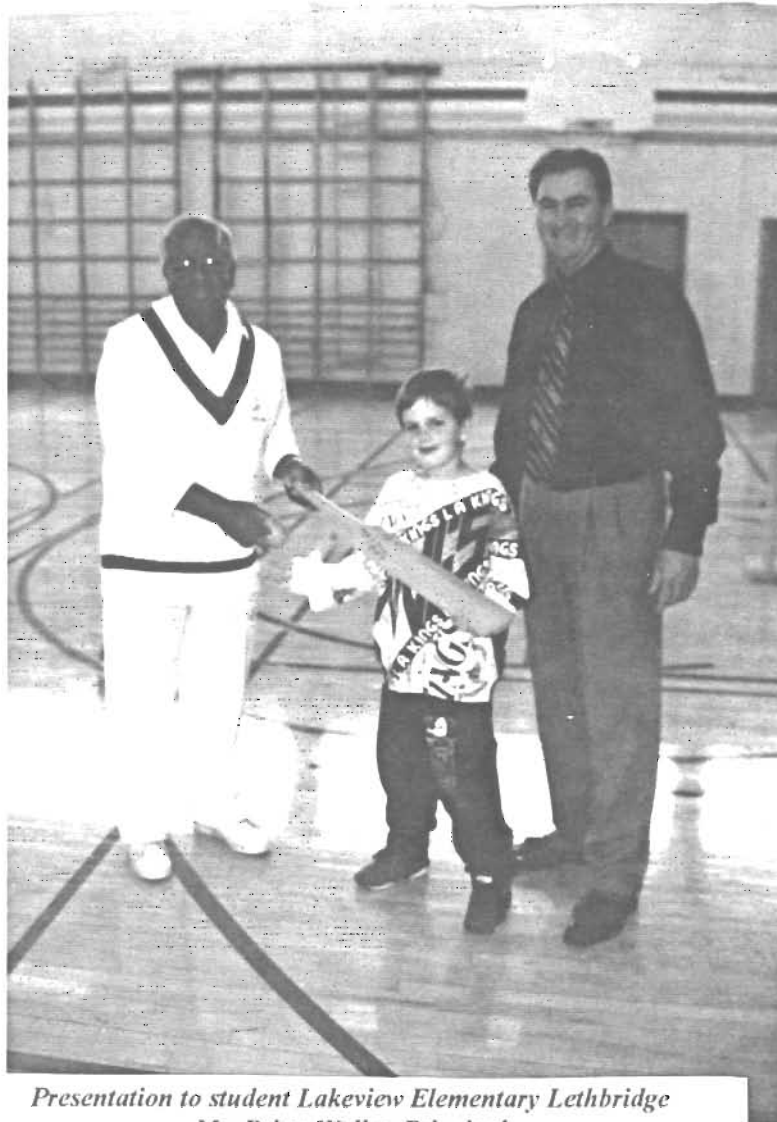
