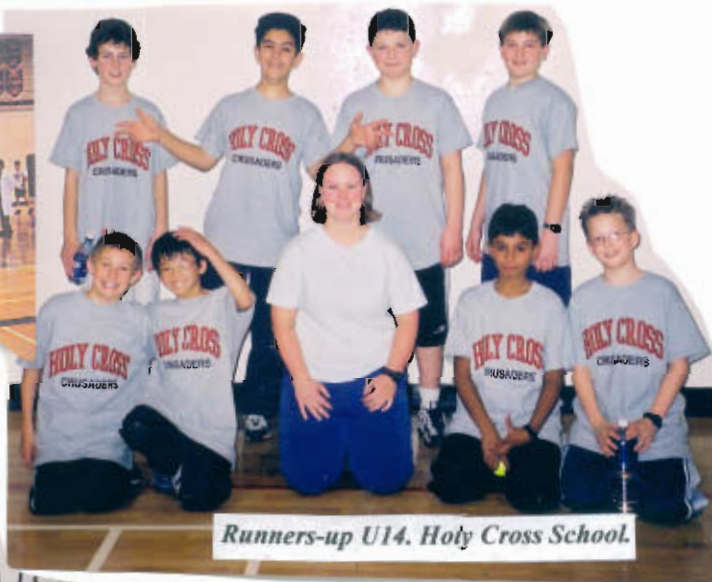

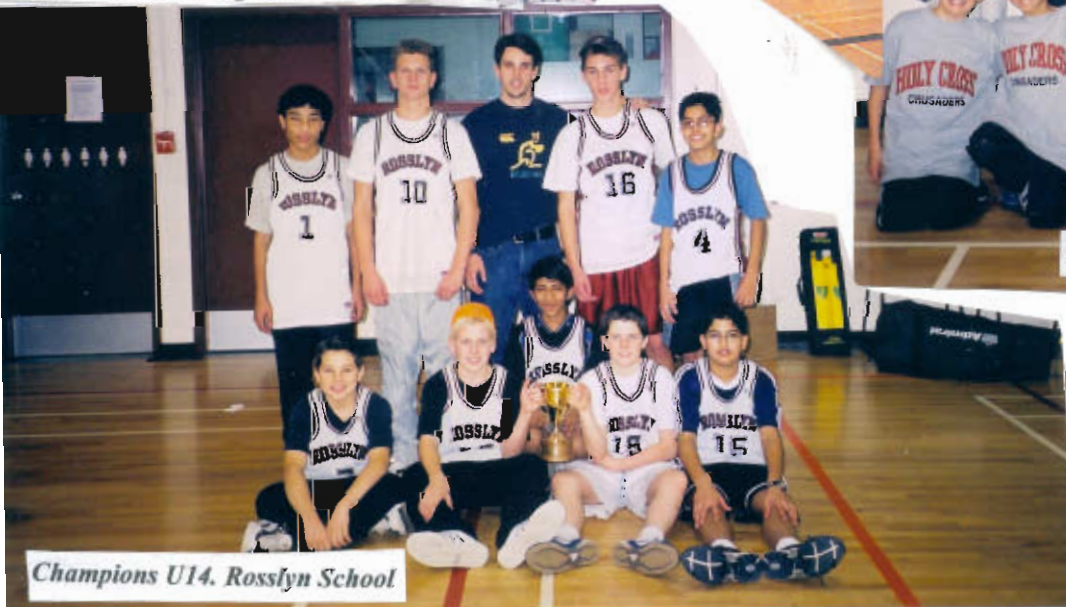

Cricket development Officer & Coach Report 2001.

During the year 2001 Eleven schools have been regularly coached. The schools will now have a total of (47) forty-seven Kangaball cricket sets. Of which (18) eighteen are donations & (11) eleven on concession to schools by ASCA. A follow up was done on (8) eight schools who play on their own within the year. The schools indoor Kangaball Tournament held in November were a great success. Crestwood U11 champions & Rosslyn once again U14 Champions. Most of the developed youth have been invited for winter developed youth training camp.

Indoor hardball cricket inter-school tournament will take place in February 2002 till end May 2002. This will be every Friday from 6to 8PM at Frere Antoine School Millwoods. Notts Sport Artificial Grass mats have been ordered from England for this purpose. It is a 16 over 8 a side game. All schools presently playing Kangaball Cricket have been informed.

Junior/Colts the elite cricketers from schools did pretty well in the E&DCL league tournament. This training gives them the opportunity to further improve their skills and be available for selection into City, Provincial & Canadian teams. It was very unfortunate that the Canada Cup U18 National Tournament 2001 was cancelled by the CCA due to the ICC tournaments that was held in Toronto.

Indoor Coaching was held at Holy Cross School from January to June 2001 on Fridays.

Outdoor Coaching at Victoria Park from April to October 2001 on Tuesdays.

It was very unfortunate that the practice nets at Millwoods built by ASCA could not be used in the year 2001, as the E&DCL did not sign the agreement prepared by Parks & Rec. The damages to the nets will be estimated in the summer of 2002.

School Holiday Coaching. Was held at St.Peters Grounds during the month of July/August 2001 for developed youth.

Live-in-Camp Red Deer. Was held from the 26th to 29th July 2001 in Red Deer. 5 players from Edmonton & 4 from Calgary attended this Provincial U18 Camp. Spencer Gooden Coach from Calgary also attended.

Summerfest Sports Festival & Exhibition. ASCA participated at this event with a stall.

Teacher's Convention Leduc. Clinic for Physiad teachers was held in January 2001.

Hardball inter-school cricket will be implemented in February 2002.

Youth training facility at Lindsay Thurber High School Red deer will be implemented before July 2002.

At the conclusion of my second year in office, I look back with mixed feelings about the accomplishments of the organization over the last year.


Christie Marathalingam and I presented at a hearing of the Board of the Alberta Gaming & Liquor Commission in February of 2001. This hearing was held in regard to whether the Alberta Schools Cricket Association was eligible to receive gaming licenses. With the clarification that the Association is not permitted to support single cricket teams, we were declared eligible, subject to provision of a business plan. This was a gratifying consequence of the hearing.

Less gratifying during the year was the fact that we were not successful in getting a joint use agreement for the Millwoods outdoor nets signed with Edmonton and District Cricket League. This was a great disappointment but one which we hope will be rectified in the coming year.

Once more a successful schools' cricket tournament was held at J. Percy Page High School in December. Those who participated thoroughly enjoyed the occasion. Mr. Marathalingam continues in his role as cricket development officer with great energy and enthusiasm. The number and diversity of schools which benefit from his coaching continues to grow. In the coming year we plan to develop a new indoor facility at Ecole Frere Antoine in Millwoods.

I look forward in the coming year to expanded participation by school cricketers to further the goal of promoting cricket amongst the youth of Alberta.

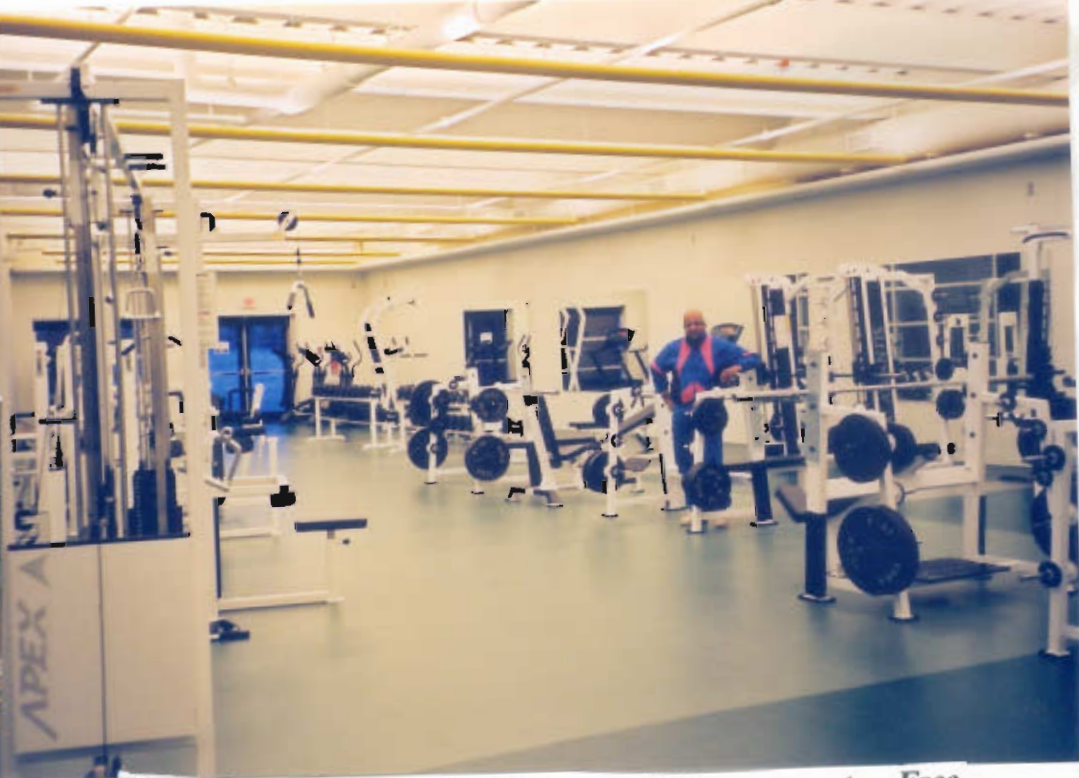
