

An expression of interest from a group in Calgary to become more actively involved in the activities of A.S.C.A. is welcomed.

The winter indoor training for combined schools continued with Dr. Bryn Whittaker and Chris Marathalingham doing the coaching. Our good fortune continues as these two skilled and dedicated individuals give of their time and themselves to promote the learning of cricket skills among our youth. They embraced the opportunity to coach at the Saville Sports Center, as our partnership with the University of Alberta resulted in a development and use agreement at this wonderful new facility.

The outdoor combined schools activities expanded to Coronation Park, where the cricket facility was re-developed to accommodate junior play. Further development at this site will occur in the spring / summer of 2005.

The performance of the 2004 Provincial U 18 team at the National Tournament in Toronto was very gratifying. The team earned the bronze medal and received accolades from other teams and coaches. Performance of U 18 and U 25 teams in inter city championships, and the exceptional individual performances of youth players in all competitions, is testament to the rapidly rising caliber of youth cricket since the inception of A.S.C.A.

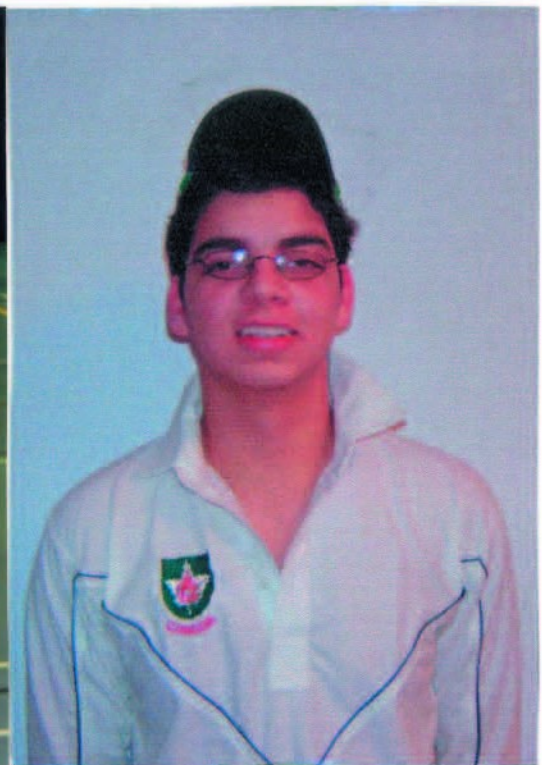
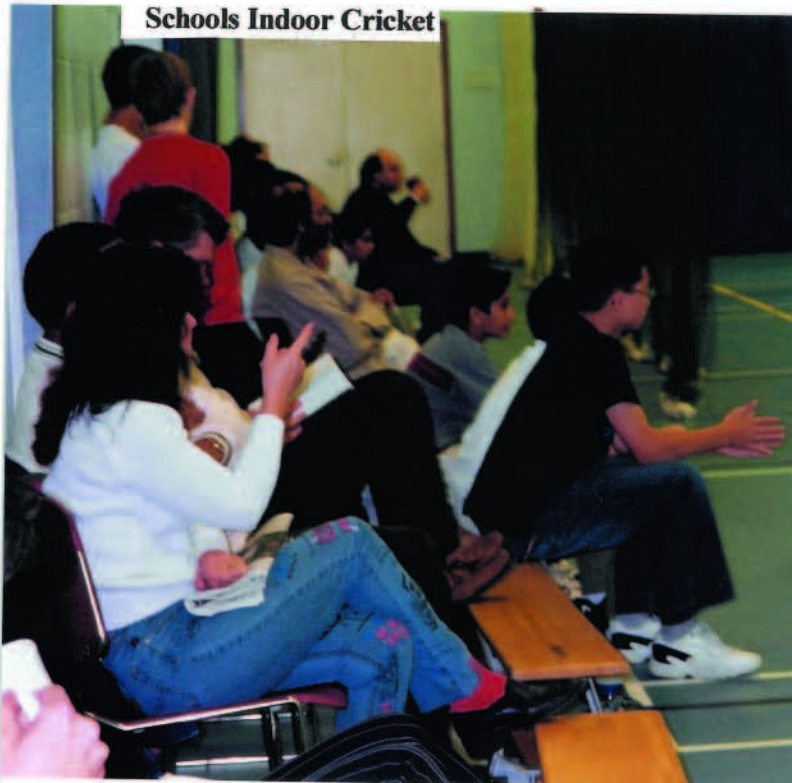
