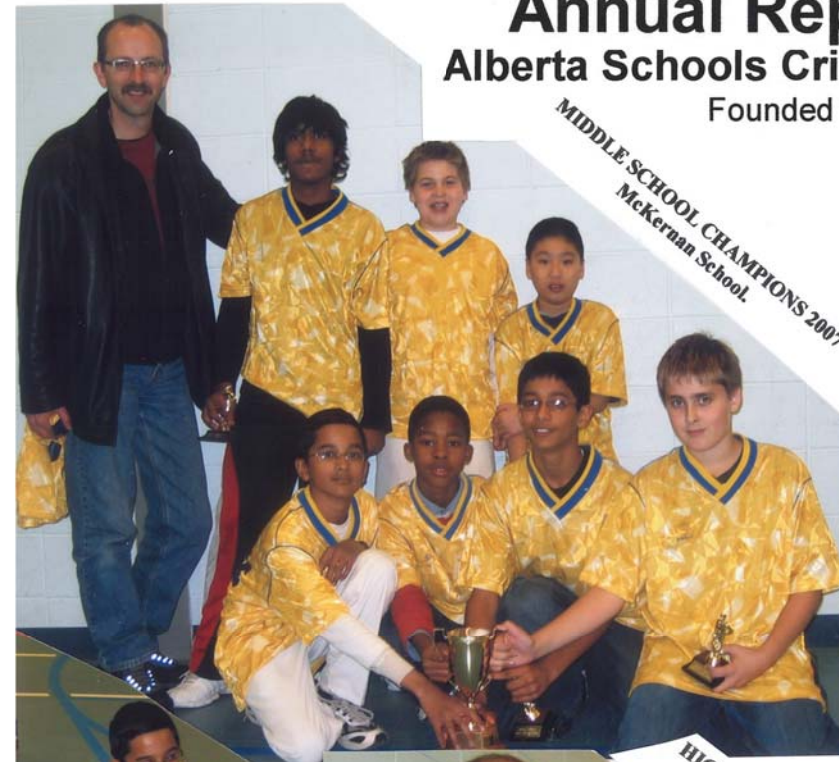

- The Performance Director/Head Coach ASCA attended the English Cricket Board Coaches Association National Conference in Warwickshire Birmingham on 19th & 20<sup>th</sup> January 2008. Working on a link between the ECBCA Coach education program and newly formed Cricket Alberta Coach Education, with this link we could share the expertise.
- A way of working together with the Alberta Leagues, Edmonton and Calgary will have enormous advantages for coach education. The Cricket Alberta Coach Education CACE program will be sponsored by the Alberta Schools Cricket Association. All clubs are required to nominate a minimum of two players to be certified as a Community Coach. These clubs will be assigned one school within the Edmonton & Calgary districts. The visits will be monitored by ASCA and appointed Coach Education Managers. The foundation set by ASCA for Schools cricket will be an asset for the coaching system.
  - New courses and support available in 2008.
- Community level coaching clinic will be available in Edmonton & Calgary before 2008 season begins.
  - University of Alberta will be coached in February and May 2008.
- U18 & U15 training Camps in January to April indoor May to August 2008 outdoors

**PRESIDENT'S REPORT 2007  
Alberta Schools Cricket Association**

For the Alberta Schools Cricket Association (A.S.C.A.) 2007 was, like 2006, a year of change and challenge. It was a year which has made us all pay more attention to the issues of capacity building in the organization.

Teams coached, mentored and otherwise supported by A.S.C.A. participated in city, inter-city, provincial and regional competitions and acquitted themselves well and with pride.

The ongoing distribution, amongst various adult teams, of youth players, previously associated with the A.S.C.A. programs, continues to support the effectiveness of organized development of school and youth cricket players.

The need for more skilled and qualified cricket coaches capable of teaching and mentoring young players is obvious. The Cricket Development Officer and Head Coach of A.S.C.A., as a direct benefit of attendance at the annual English Cricket Board Coaches Association National Conference, will embark on an ambitious plan to develop more coaches by inviting league teams to sponsor one or two players to participate in the Cricket Alberta Coach Education program.

It would be hoped that these coaches could be attached to schools in their neighborhoods and develop cricket coaching programs at these schools, similar to those currently run by the A.S.C.A. Head Coach.

It is hoped that this expansion of the ranks of junior cricket coaches and the resulting interest in A.S.C.A. will give new life to the organization, so that it can continue to provide opportunities to our youth to be exposed to the wonderful game of cricket.

As I enter my final year as the President of A.S.C.A., I extend my sincere congratulations to all the players. Thank you to all the board members who have contributed during my tenure, but my most profound thanks goes to Chris Marathalingham, who remains the soul of A.S.C.A. My best wishes to you all for your ongoing success.

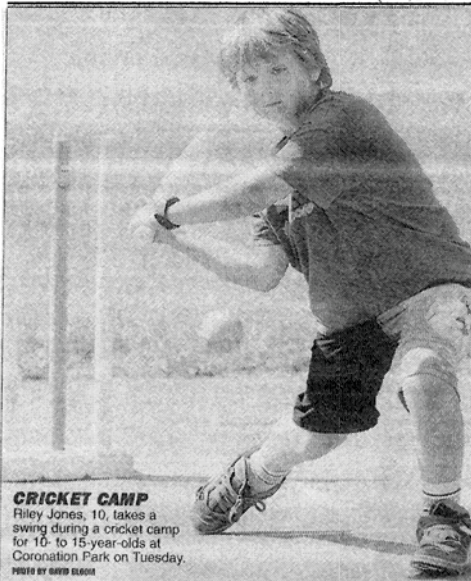

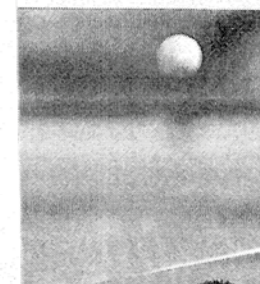
